The Mt. Joy Township Supervisors held their re-organization meeting on Monday January 2, 1984 at 7:00 p.m. at the township municipal building on Hoffman Home Road. All members were present.

It was decided to retain Wilbur Danner as laborer at the same pay rate as supervisors.

Joan Huff was retained as Planning Commission Secretary at a salary of \$178.00 per year (44.50 per quarter).

Secretary's pay rate was increased to \$3,885.00 per year. Glenn Snyder refrained from discussing and voting on this matter.

It was decided to recommend to the auditors that the Treasurer's Bond should remain at \$125,000.00.
