

August 10, 1989

The Mt. Joy Township Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting on Thursday, August 10, 1989 at the township municipal building on Hoffman Home Road. Wilbur Danner was absent.

The minutes were approved by motion of Glenn Snyder, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Harry Hilbert, carried.

The treasurer's report and bills to be paid were approved by motion of Snyder, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Hilbert, carried.

Lake Heritage Sewer Expansion - Bill Hill was present and went over the area to be included for the sewer expansion. Supervisors told Mr. Hill that they would like to see a larger portion of Highland Avenue Road included in the expansion area.

Pennsylvania Classic Cable - Jeff Davis was present and wanted the supervisors to approve a resolution to change Classic Cable Company to Masada Cable Partners. Supervisors will take under advisement and discuss this matter with their solicitor. Traffic study on Route 97 south of Frogtown - A letter was received from Penn Dot stating that 85% of the vehicles traveling were under 57 MPH. 21% exceeding legal speed limit. Their recommendation was to enforce the speed limit of 55 mph and not to lower the speed limit to 45 MPH as requested by the supervisors.

Pat Black - was served notice that she has 30 days to connect to the Lake Heritage sewer system.

Letter was received from County Commissioners stating that bridge inspection is underway in County.

Letter was received from Department of Community Affairs stating that our Flood Plain Ordinance is acceptable to the department.

Ag-district - There was an additional 819 acres proposed for the Ag District in Mt. Joy Township. On a motion by Snyder, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Hilbert, it was agreed that all 819 acres were eligible and will be added to the Ag District.

Junk Yards - Davies and Hollinger have not submitted application for license. Solicitor to write letter to said parties giving them until September 1 to comply. Mr. Davies has also agreed to install fence by October 1 around his yard.

Marty Miller/Lake Heritage entrance - No progress has been made with the Lake Heritage Property Owners Association at this time. Supervisors were told that 2/3 of the property owners have to approve any sale of property.

Road salt - Price was received from Cargill of \$38,64/ton delivered and \$42.00/ton picked up. Price will be good for one year.

Comment from the floor - Mr. Kelley had questions concerning Mr. Davies junkyard and sewer on Highland Avenue Road.

Meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
