

September 14, 1983

The Mt. Joy Township Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting on Wednesday September 14, 1983 at 7:30 p.m. at the township municipal building on Hoffman Home Road. All members were present.

The minutes were approved by motion of Glenn Snyder, 2nd by Harry Hilbert, carried.

The treasurer's report and bills to be paid were approved by motion of Jim Neth, 2nd by Hilbert, carried. A check was approved for the current electric bill which arrived in the mail this day. This was approved by motion of Snyder, 2nd by Neth, carried.

Supervisors agreed to let the LHMA have a 25 foot right-of-way as required in the township's sub-division ordinance, for the sewage treatment plant.

Snyder read a thank you letter from the Adams County Office for Aging for our annual contribution.

Payment for 2.8 miles of road (Barlow-Two Taverns), which the state turned back to the township, will be removed from liquid fuel monies and we will be given \$2500.00 per mile.

Neth read a letter from Adams County Public Library stating the statistics for Mt. Joy Township and requested township to consider this in preparing the 1984 budget.

Letter read from Adams County Commissioners in regard to the Gypsy Moth Program for the upcoming year.

A letter was read from SCATCOM - They want township to send necessary application for right of cable TV franchise in the township. Secretary to give Sam Teeter copy of this letter.

Road work is almost completed.
