

September 10, 1986

The Mt. Joy Township Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting on Wednesday September 10, 1986 at 7:30 p.m. at the township municipal building on Hoffman Home Road. All members were present.

The minutes were approved by motion of Glenn Snyder, 2nd by Wilbur Danner, carried.

The treasurer's report and bills to be paid were approved by motion of Harry Hilbert, 2nd by Danner, carried.

The subdivision plan of John Kresky was approved by motion of Glenn Snyder, 2nd by Danner, carried.

A petition for "quiet title" for a portion of abandoned White Church Road going through Tom Pyle's property will be done and the balance of the road will have a private 30' right-of-way to properties along said portion.

John Sanders - Snyder & Dean Shultz went to Sander's trailer upon receiving a written complaint about sewage coming to the top of the ground. They found that the tank has a broken top and do not believe there are any lines to the tank. Sanders was told he will have to get a permit and have solid testes done and put drainage fields to this tank after the tank is repaired.

Shull property (Wilson Clapsaddle) - Found sewage coming to the top of the ground at this property. Snyder made a motion to give them 30 days to have this situation remedied, 2nd by Hilbert, carried.

Roads - finished and bills paid. Working on widening Goulden Road in order to pave this road next spring. Highland Avenue has a hole in road at a tile.

Mrs. Davies (this property is behind the Frank Schriver property) off White Church Road would like to divide her 24 acres into three (3) 8-acre lots in order that each of her children would get a lot. She was told that since she does not have frontage on a public road this would not meet sub-division and was told that we could not approve a sub-division of this order.
