

November 13, 1986

The Mt. Joy Township Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting on Thursday, November 13, 1986 at the township municipal building on Hoffman Home Road. All members were present.

The minutes were approved by motion of Wilbur Danner, 2nd by Glenn Snyder, carried.

The treasurer's report and bills to be paid were approved by Snyder, 2nd by Danner, carried. Snyder also approved that the township officials who attended the convention the previous evening at Barlow Fire Hall be paid, 2nd by Danner, carried.

The following budget was tentatively approved by motion of Snyder, 2nd by Danner, carried: Total budget for 1987 - \$509,522.00. All the tax rates will be the same as in 1986.

Secretary to advertise.

Cargill delivered salt to township shed.

Roads are basically ready for winter, except that there are still some weeds to be mowed.

A letter was read from Mrs. Alice Phiel of Two-Taverns. She complained that there was an open drainage ditch on the George Tyler property. Snyder checked this out and found nothing but water. (This letter was received in September) On October 14, 1986 - Township received a letter from DER in response to Mrs. Phiel's complaint. October 30, 1986 - Township received a Certified Letter from Mrs. Phiel requesting that an onsite investigation be conducted by the supervisors to determine the purpose and use of the ditch on Mr. Tyler's property and that the results of this investigation be reported to her in writing. The supervisors again checked this drainage ditch and also had the township's Sewage Enforcement Officer present to check out the situation. They found that there was no sewer in the gun shop and that the drainage ditch was used to drain water from around the building which houses a gun shop. In continuing this investigation the supervisors noted that on August 26, 1983 the Phiel's got a permit to build a garage on their property. This permit stated that there is indeed a sewer facility and an apartment above the garage has been occupied for several years. On November 13, 1986 the township received a letter from the Sewage Enforcement Officer advising the supervisors what course of action to take. He suggested that the township notify the Phiels of our findings, in addition to this he told us that the house was possibly sold. A motion was made by Snyder to have Solicitor and Dean Shultz draft a letter and send it to Mrs. Phiel, 2nd by Harry Hilbert, carried.

Maitland Brothers have a mobile home on their property and it is being occupied and they do not have a sewer or building permit. Supervisors to have solicitor draft and send a letter to Maitland Brothers.

Fabrick - nothing further to report on this.

Roadite - still no response concerning reimbursement for stone on Long Road.

Meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m. by motion of Danner, 2nd by Snyder, carried.
