Schwartz Non-building Waiver, Erik Vranich	Mr. Vranich presented a plan for a subdivision located down Furney, Barlow Two Tavern and White Church Road. It is an existing lot, three tracts to be subdivided into 18 lots marked agricultural. This means no sewage planning, no sewage testing, which is why they are coming for a non-building waiver. The plan as submitted is laid out in a manner that is similar to a typical building lot configuration. Ron Garis, Beyond all Boundaries stated that the total acreage is 285 inherited from Violet	Mr. Schwartz said to withdraw the plan.	

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2. Mockenhaupt Benefits Group General Employees' Pension	Schwartz to three siblings, Lyman Schwartz, Ronald Schwartz, and Cheryl Weaver. They want to subdivide the 285 acres evenly between the three as agriculture lots which is why they are seeking a non-building waiver. Mr. Vranich explained that a Non-building Waiver is intended to be used on large acreage lots where there is no need for sewage planning or risk for future building on the lot. The DEP non-waiver form states that the Twp accepts full responsibility to identify any violation and to provide soil testing and any other environmental assessments. The Twp Solicitor explained if DEP believes the Twp is granting non-building waivers for the purpose of deferring sewage planning for development in the future then what DEP can do is order you as the Twp to bear the entire cost of doing the planning for this property, all 18 lots. Literally you become the planner for the developer and incur all of the costs. Mr. Bowman speaking as a member of the Planning Commission felt that the Planning Commission would not approve this. Mr. Gormont said from the Board's standpoint based on the opinions of Mr. Clark and the guidance of the Twp Solicitor that granting a non-building waiver is not the appropriate thing for the Twp to do. To do so, potentially places on the Twp the burden of future Act 537 compliance. The lots do not have perc sites and that is an absolute requirement. The Board asked if they wanted to withdraw the plan submitted. Mr. Schwartz said to withdraw the plan. Ordinance to rescind previous Ordinances 2001-04 and 2005-02.
