

December 28, 1978

The Mt. Joy Township Supervisors held a special meeting on December 28, 1978 at the Township Municipal Building on Hoffman Home Road. All members were present.

Minutes were approved by motion of Glenn Snyder, 2nd by Danner, carried.

Treasurer's report was approved by motion of Snyder, 2nd by Danner, carried.

Tom Gibbons consented to be our representative on the LHMA. He will succeed Mr. Herbert Plunkert. Term of appointment is five (5) years. This action was approved by motion of Danner, 2nd by Snyder, carried.

The 1979 budget was adopted by motion of Snyder, 2nd by Danner, carried.

Revenue Sharing will be \$17,665.00. Tax rate same - 5 mills. Equipment tax - 1 mill. Per Capita Tax - \$5.00. Total budget (all funds) \$105,975.00

LHMA wants money from township for regional sewer - we will take under advisement with Sam Teeter, solicitor.

A public hearing was held on the closing of Benner Road and Rock Creek Ford Road. Mr. Ed. Benner was present concerning the closing of Benner Road, and he had no objections. A motion was made by Snyder to close Benner Road since he or no one else had any objections, 2nd by Danner, carried. On the closing of Rock Creek Ford Road - Mr. and Mrs. Lee Ramsburg were present concerning this road. They were very opposed to the closing of this road unless their tax assessment is lowered because we're taking away their road frontage. Also, they wanted the supervisors to promise to make the road hard into their property and also double the maintenance on the road. In other words, they want TOP Priority. The board had no comments to make in response to their wants! Mr. Mark Miller was also there concerning the closing of Rock Creek Ford Road and he had no objections. The Board took this matter under advisement with their solicitor, Mr. Sam Teeter.

Lake Heritage Treatment Plant - Mr. Dave Lewis from Lake Heritage was present concerning this matter. He said they were having problems with the grinder pump at treatment plant and this was the reason for solids coming through and into the stream. The grinder pump is in the process of being repaired and this will correct the problem. He also said the new plant criteria is to be a lot better than the present one. A motion was made by Snyder to pass resolution allowing LHMA to install a second treatment plant, 2nd by Danner, carried.

Mr. Lewis also read a letter about the water study for Lake Heritage. The board instructed Mr. Teeter to draught a resolution about Lake Heritage Municipal Water Authority, by motion of Snyder, 2nd by Danner, carried.

Next meeting will be held January 2, 1979 to reorganize.

Board will meeting January 3, 1979 at 9:00 a.m. with the auditors.

Meeting adjourned at 9:15 p.m.
