

May 9, 1980

The Mt. Joy Township Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting on Friday May 9, 1980 at 7:30 p.m. at the township municipal building on Hoffman Home Road. All members were present.

The minutes were approved by motion of Glenn Snyder, 2nd by Jim Neth, carried.

The treasurer's report was approved by motion of Neth, 2nd by Snyder, carried.

A motion was made by Neth to pay all bills as they appear on the treasurer's report, 2nd by Snyder, carried.

A letter was read from Ken Cole stating that the speed limit on Route 97 from Gettysburg to Two Taverns had been lowered to 45 m.p.h.

A letter was read from REA and approval was given for them to make a study for a cable TV service in the township.

Letter was read from Adams County Planning Commission about improvement of bridges and roads in township. Priority on bridges was #1 Roberts Road bridge and second priority was bridge on Alloways Road. Under roads was #1 priority was route 97 from Cumberland Township line to Two Taverns and second priority was Hoffman Home Road to Barlow Road.

Speed limit on Highland Avenue was discussed. Supervisors feel that it should be lowered to 35 m.p.h. Motion was made by Neth, 2nd by Snyder, carried to have ordinance drafted by solicitor to lower speed limit to 35 m.p.h.

Ken Cole spoke on the Junk Yard Ordinance. He took it to Harrisburg and had it reviewed by the local government research lawyer. The ordinance is constitutional and the solicitor did an excellent job of drafting it, was the reply from the lawyer.

There were about twenty (20) people present from the township at this meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 9:00 p.m. by motion of Snyder, 2nd by Neth, carried.
